Science Fiction/Fantasy Book Club - Looking to immerse yourself in a different world? The Science Fiction/Fantasy Book Club meets on Tuesday evenings, led by Fiction Coordinator Nancy Nadeau. January's pick is A House with Good Bones by T. Kingfisher.

Morning Book Clubs - Monday and Thursday morning book discussions are led by Fiction Coordinator Nancy Nadeau. Featured books can be from any genre. January's pick is In the Time of the Butterflies by Julia Alvarez.


## Live Author Event — Plantation Goods: A Material History of American Slavery with Seth Rockman Saturday, February 1st @ 2:00 p.m.


